<p>Two <i>2B Graphite pencils</i> Two <i>HB Graphite pencils</i> Two <i>(two) 2H Graphite pencils</i></p> <p>(Most brands found at art stores are suitable. Do not purchase the “Graphite Sticks”. Only use pencils with wooden barrels. Examples of brands are Staedtler; “Mars Lumograph”; Derwent; Bruynzeel</p>	<p><i>1 or 2 Kneadable Erasers</i> Staedtler or Design brands (the latter is available at AboveGround Art Supply).</p> <p><i>1 white eraser</i> such as made by Staedtler</p> <p><i>1 (or more) sheet of sandpaper</i>, approx. 200 grit</p> <p><i>1 “Snap-off blade” cutting knife</i> such as those made by Olfa. Buy one of the larger ones—they are safer.</p> <p><i>Knitting Needle</i> (used for measuring). The needle should be either a 2.5 or 3.5 mm and about 30cm long.</p> <p><i>Masking Tape</i>: The best kind is 3M Brand “High Tack”, available at AboveGround Art Supply.</p>	<p><i>1 pad of white drawing paper.</i> Cartridge paper pad 18 X 24.</p> <p><i>2 drawing boards— 18 X 24.</i> Boards are best when made of wood (1/4 in. spruce plywood “Good 1-Side” is excellent); art pins, staples, thumb-tacks, and tape can be used on them.</p>
