

Introduction to a Colour Theory — Workshop with Juan Martinez

Materials List

Canvas: All that is needed will be 2 or 3 small canvases, approximately 10 x 14 will or 9 x 12 will do nicely. Other surfaces and materials will be provided for various colour exercises.

Brushes: *Since creating fully rendered paintings is not the goal of this workshop, one needn't be too concerned about brushes. So, bring whatever oil painting brushes you have on hand. The following is a suggested list which is useful well beyond the workshop's requirements :*

Qty	Brush Type and Shape
(9)	Bristle ("hog's hair")
	2 larger (1/2 to 1 in.) — filbert or square 4 medium — filbert or square 4 small — 3 square or filbert; 1 round
(9)	Soft: Synthetic mongoose is best. Should be springy; not too soft. NOTE: do not use SOFT square or brights, only filbert or rounds are useful in the soft-haired brush varieties
	6 medium — 2 round (pointed); 4 filbert 3 small — filbert or round

Paint: Titanium White - Winsor & Newton
(W&N) or any good brand.
(Oil paint Only) Lamp Black or Ivory Black
Ultramarine Blue
Viridian Green
Burnt Umber
Raw Umber
Yellow Ochre Pale (W&N), or any brand of Mars Yellow
Burnt Sienna
Alizarin Crimson Permanent
*Cadmium Red Mid
*Cadmium Yellow

**Use true Cadmiums, not "hues". If you don't already have them, then purchase only the smallest tubes. Although, they are important colours, we don't use much of them!*

NOTE: Bring whatever other colours you have ... it's fun to experiment!

Mediums & Thinners:

- Linseed oil
- Recommended for workshop is. M.Graham Alkyd/Walnut Medium. This dries overnight and is non-toxic. Can be hard to find, though.
- Odourless Mineral Spirits (OMS). Examples: Turpenoid™, Gamsol™.

Miscellaneous: 2 (two) Small cups with sealable lids for medium or solvents
A clean glass jar with lid for mineral spirits.
Palette knife — a short, narrow blade is best
Palette — Paper palettes are quick and convenient, but wooden palette is fine, too
Roll of paper towels or Box of tissue or Clean rag(s) or all three
Mahl stick is recommended
